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Everyone has a unique story, the right to be treated with respect, and the right to be involved in decisions about their own health care. The service supports individuals throughout their life, through the provision of clinical services, support, education and promotion of healthy life choices. Concerns about health are universal, no matter what your sexual orientation.

Are you overdue for a Pap Smear?

Have you recently had sex with someone you don't know or have you started a new relationship?

Sexually transmissible infections (STIs) don't always have symptoms, so you could have an STI without knowing and pass it on to someone else. It's important to have regular check-ups. Testing for STIs is simple and the majority are easily treated.

The Sexual Health Service at the Bellerive Quay Health Hub offers patients a confidential space, free of judgement, to improve their health and wellbeing. The service believes in optimising health outcomes for individuals to improve their sexual health at different stages throughout life. The service is staffed by a Sexual Health Nurse Practitioner passionate about men's, women's and LGBTI health covering preventative health, diagnostics, and treatments, including:
